he 2022/23 season will be remembered for its unprecedented successes, setting new records, and pushing boundaries. Our programs showcase Newport Classical's commitment to the community through meaningful and consistent classical music education in local schools, free and accessible community engagements, a flourishing commissioning initiative, and the presentation of programming that prioritizes artistic excellence and memorable concert experiences.

With the second season of the Chamber Series at our new home, the Newport Classical Recital Hall, we presented eight exceptional concerts featuring the next generation of world-class musicians including Randall Goosby, and Stella Chen who was recently named Young Artist of the Year at Gramophone Awards. This series continued to serve as the framework for our Music Education and Engagement Initiative, which brings our guest musicians into Newport County classrooms each month to provide enrichment and access to exceptional classical music and reached 70% more students than the previous year.

This year, we were so grateful to have earned the support of BankNewport for our Community Concerts Series, which continues to offer free performances in neighborhoodcentered locations around Newport County and welcome hundreds of listeners of all ages.

The 2023 Newport Classical Music Festival welcomed over 7,500 patrons over 20 days to 33 performances and events, including 39% first-time attendees! We were so thrilled to experience spellbinding performances together with you, including concerts by Hélène Grimaud, Kelli O'Hara, Cantus and The Knights, to name a few. Be sure to mark your calendars for the 55th Music Festival next summer: July 4–21, 2024 for another array of one-of-a-kind performances.





# Music Education and Engagement Initiative

n its third year, the Newport Classical Music Education and Engagement Initiative continues to excel in providing no-cost musical enrichment opportunities. This season, the initiative successfully inspired 763 students in local schools, marking a substantial growth in the program's impact. The initiative has experienced a 70% increase in the number of children served compared to the previous year, highlighting its expanding reach and influence. Additionally, over 100 free tickets have been generously provided to the local community, underscoring our dedication to fostering a love for classical music accessible to all. The success of the initiative stands as a testament to our ongoing commitment to inspire the next generation of arts advocates, musicians, and music lovers.


ighlights of the 2023 Newport Classical Music Festival included performances by renowned pianists Simone Dinnerstein, Hélène Grimaud, and Charlie Albright; celebrated chamber ensembles including the Hermitage Piano Trio, Aizuri String Quartet, Excelsis Percussion Quartet, Sinta Saxophone Quartet, and Fenway Quintet; acclaimed cellists Zlatomir Fung and Amit Peled; Broadway and opera star Kelli O'Hara (currently starring in HBO's The Gilded Age, filmed in Newport); Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra; The Knights; New York Philharmonic principal clarinetist Anthony McGill in a return performance with pianist Anna Polonsky; riveting low-voice acapella ensemble Cantus; charismatic Norwegian violinist Eldbjørg Hemsing; and the world premiere of The Gilded Cage, a new work commissioned by Newport Classical from three-time GRAMMY®-nominated violinist/composer Curtis Stewart.

Other highlights included the Festival's popular Opera Night at The Breakers presenting Così fan tutte in a bold new un-staged production, Sunrise Meditations concerts, a concert inspired by nature at Norman Bird Sanctuary, a free Fourth of July concert at King Park, and nine performances by the talented 2023 Newport Classical Festival Artists throughout July contributed to the Festival's dynamic and engaging program offerings.

The 54th Newport Classical Music Festival took place from July 4-23, 2023. The successful Festival garnered critical acclaim for the broad range of composers, artists, and sounds from the classical genre.

## FINANCES:

### **OPERATIONAL SUMMARY**

The organization continued its path toward long-term financial stability over the course of the 2022/23 season with another balanced budget and healthy cash position. Corrigan Financial, with oversight from the Finance and Investment Committee, has continued to oversee the Capital Reserve, which was valued at \$1,323,078 at the close of the fiscal year. The committee is co-led by Treasurer Melanie Niemiec and Investment Chair Steve Johnson.

As a part of the Newport Classical Board of Directors' governance duties, it formed a separate Audit Committee overseen by Committee Chair Joan Sweeney, and is pleased to share that the Committee completed two successful audits of the financial statements and management policies for fiscal years 2022 and 2023, both resulting in clean opinions and management letters.

Newport Classical also successfully exceeded all fundraising goals, resulting in an operating surplus, which allowed the organization to sustain its operational cash reserve and make a contribution to the Capital Reserve.

The financials shared in this report correlate with the most recent audited financial statements.


